WHO WE ARE

The Katherine Michiels School has provided progressive, child-centered education to the San Francisco community since 1976. Housed in

a beautiful Victorian home, KMS defies the norms in terms of setting. The school's rooms are open and airy and camp-goers will have lots of space and materials to build hand-made piñatas in the art room or practice Mexican folk dance in the school's dance studio.

WHAT WE DO

De Colores Summer Spanish Camp will take the learning of a second language out of the classroom and into the community. Using *The Mission* as our teacher, students will learn by doing, venturing into the neighborhood daily to practice their speaking, listen to real conversations, and see the language written before them.

- We will play *fútbol*,
- swim in the local *piscina*,
- join neighborhood activities at parks,
- plan a Mexican meal using traditional ingredients,
- go on field trips to *mercados*, *galerias*, and *museos*.

When at KMS, your child will experience the Spanish language through music, dance, theater, and of course, their native-speaking counselors, who will guide them through the ins and outs of the Spanish language.

Maria Luna brings over 27 years of experience teaching Spanish, Mexican folk dance and culture to pre-school, elementary and middle school children. A native from Mexico City, Ms. Luna has collaborated with World Arts West, Young Audiences of Northern California, The Burbank Center of the Arts and KQED educational programs. Katherine Michiels School (KMS) is proud to announce the return of its hugely popular, De Colores Spanish Summer Camp, a Spanish Language and Latino Culture camp that puts the fun back into learning a language. De Colores means colorful. It is the title of a traditional Mexican song that, like our summercamp, celebrates life!

Using music, dance, arts, crafts and theater, children will speak, listen and interact within a community of Spanish speakers. Through this immersion-style program, your child will come to love learning, living and practicing Spanish. Instruction is based on creative, interactive activities, rather than desk-style learning. De Colores runs for four consecutive two-week sessions. Sign your child up for as many sessions as you like. We look forward to having your child join us this summer!

WHY WE'RE DIFFERENT

De Colores changes the model from language instruction to language construction! Many children have received ten years of language instruction by the time they leave high school, yet most lack the basic skills needed to converse, understand and feel confident speaking in Spanish. Real confidence doesn't arise from desk-learning, but from being immersed in a culture that speaks the language. While other camps attempt to provide a similar immersion experience for children, De Colores' location, in the heart of *The Mission District*, allows for real-life experience of the Spanish language. Students will take creative movement classes, build drums and shakers to play at camp performances, learn to make guacamole and tortillas—at the same time that they learn conversation basics and pertinent vocabulary. De Colores takes the language camp experience to new heights with their hands-on approach.

grupo AZUL

Ages 5-6: 9am-3pm

This group of campers will be exposed to Spanish in a friendly, playful and positive way. Learning will be integrated into the children's daily routine, in a manner that relates directly to them and their interests. We will play games, sing songs, make masks, and venture to parks. Most of our "learning" will be experienced through play and physical movement, and children will enjoy both structured activities and free time.

A typical day might include:

- Welcome songs and games
- Arts and Crafts projects
- Creative movement
- Lunch and free time
- An outdoor adventure in the neighborhood

grupo MAGENTA

Ages 7-11: 9am-3pm

This second group of campers will experience the language through a larger emphasis on cultural traditions. Learning will continue to be focused on hands-on experience, but we will go further in depth on a given topic. For example, we may take a field trip to visit the murals of the neighborhood and then work on our own large-scale paintings that tell a story about our lives. Or we may listen to Latin percussion and then make our own drums and perform for the younger campers. Before we head out to the mercados on Mission Street, we may act out a scenario in which we learn the basics of ordering at a restaurant, how to ask questions from a grocer, and the way to say potato, onion, or pineapple in Spanish.

A typical day might include:

- Welcome games and day-planning
- An adventure in the neighborhood
- Lunch and free time to work on projects
- Arts and crafts
- Creative movement
